

Athletics Canada National Track & Field Tour

1. Introduction

- 1.1. As stated in its <u>2028 Strategic Plan</u>, Athletics Canada aims to develop an "Increased number of high-level competitions in Canada". To achieve this Athletics Canada aims to work closely with its Provincial/Territorial Branches and Local Organizing Committees (LOCs), to host a series of high-performance competitions, for athletes in both the Olympic & Paralympic streams, during the outdoor track & field season.
- 1.2. The purpose of National Track & Field Tour is to:
 - 1.2.1. Provide meaningful competition opportunities for athletes, at home, in Canada
 - 1.2.2. Host events whereby Canadian athletes can earn valuable World Ranking points
 - 1.2.3. Reduce the amount of travel for Canadian Athletes
 - 1.2.4. Help to develop Canadian athletes for future National Team representation

2. General Principles

- 2.1. The National Track & Field Tour provides clearly understood differing levels of competition based on prize money and quality of organisation for international one-day Meetings, subject to fulfilment of the minimum requirements set out in both in this document and in the World Athletics Continental Tour Regulations.
- 2.2. Organisers agree to observe and respect all Rules and Regulations, and decisions taken by Athletics Canada and World Athletics
- 2.3. Each year organizers must submit an application to Athletics Canada for inclusion in the National Track & Field Tour.

3. World Athletics World Ranking System

- 3.1. World Athletics has undertaken to create a global Ranking System where athletes score points based on a combination of result and place depending on the level of the competition in which the result is achieved. The ranking is then based on their average score over a certain number of competitions in a defined period of time. The calendar of the competitions, where athletes are able to score ranking points, is limited to competitions holding a World Athletics or National Permit.
- 3.2. World Athletics has the exclusive right to determine to which Category a given competition should be assigned. Categorization of Area Permit competitions will be agreed with the corresponding Area Association. Specific national permit competitions (other than National Senior Championships) will be placed in category E as designated by the Member Federation in agreement with, and subject to quotas established by World Athletics. All other national permit competitions are placed in category F.

4. National Track & Field Tour Applications

- 4.1. Applications to the National Track & Field Tour must be submitted via application to Athletics Canada by **Sept 30, 2024.**
- 4.2. In the absence of receiving confirmation of an upgrade, all other competitions sanctioned by World Athletics will be processed according to "Category F" in the World Athletics rankings.

5. Competition Eligibility Requirements

- 5.1. Meet Directors wishing to have their competition considered for the 2025 Athletics Canada National Track & Field Tour must meet the following eligibility requirements:
 - 5.1.1. LOCs must be an affiliated Club/Organization/Society for which, all individual members must have a current and appropriate Athletics Canada Provincial/Territorial Branch membership
 - 5.1.2. Competition must be sanctioned by a Provincial/Territorial Branch
 - 5.1.3. Competition must obtain approval from World Para Athletics (WPA)
 - 5.1.4. Competition must align with one of the Competition Label Minimum Requirements outlined below
