A lover of adventure, Mark celebrated significant milestones in his life with extraordinary travels.

His 60th birthday was marked by a trek to Machu Picchu, and at 65, he conquered Mount Kilimanjaro.

Though he had planned to embark on the Annapurna Circuit Trek in Nepal for his 70th birthday, his journey was sadly cut short.
